

Sunday, February 12, 2023 Doors Open at 6:00 PM


Join your fellow Elks at the lodge to watch the Eagles take on the Chiefs in the 57th edition of the Super Bowl.

# EMOTIONAL RESILIENCE MISSION READINESS HEALTHY REINTEGRATION



In honor of those who served, Berea Elks Lodge #1815 and American Legion Post 91 of Berea have partnered to host a <u>FREE</u> Veterans Wellness Program addressing reintegration to civilian life, PTSD mitigation, and learning personal health warning signs.

#### SATURDAY, MARCH 5, 2023 - 1:00 PM to 5:00 PM

- Learn how to impact your personal health and wellness and learn the warning signs of deteriorated wellness for fellow veterans and others.
- Take aways will include an ability to track wellness metrics through wearable devices provided by our program.
- Learn how to build a foundational routine for an understanding about HOW and WHY, rather only learning WHAT impacts wellness.

We will feature a presentation on building foundational routines to improve resilience:

The 3Rs Path: Emotional Resilience
Mission Readiness
Healthy Reintegration

## BEREA ELKS RAISE \$2,000 FOR POLICE MEMORIAL FUND

On January 7, 2023, Berea Lodge #1815 hosted a Doubles Dart Tournament to benefit the Greater Cleveland Peace Officers Memorial Society (GCPOMS) a non-profit charity, whose mission is to honor peace officers who have made the supreme sacrifice in the performance of service to their communities and the nation, especially those from the Greater Cleveland area, including Cuyahoga, Geauga, Lake, Lorain, Medina, and northern Summit Counties.

Eighteen teams from law enforcement, and Elks members from Berea Lodge #1815, Willoughby-Cleveland Lodge #18; and Lakewood Lodge #1350, competed for top awards, raising a total of approximately \$2,000 for the fund.

Refreshments were donated by <u>Teamz Restaurant & Bar</u> and <u>Café Ah Roma</u>. <u>The Cleveland Darter Club</u> donated the use of the boards and <u>Anglo-American Darts and Discs</u> donated flights to attendees.
