
# BEREAELKSBULLHORN A Newsletter of the Berea Elks Lodge #1815



### Armistice Day - Veteran's Day & The B.P.O.E.

Before WWII, November 11 was originally called Armistice Day, marking the end of World War I and what was optimistically called "The War to End All Wars."


When fighting ceased in November 1918, President Woodrow Wilson gave General John Pershing, American Expeditionary Force Commander of WWI and lifelong Elk, the honor of setting the exact moment that the Armistice would forever be marked.

Pershing selected the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month – his personal tribute to the memory of those soldiers, "Elks and non-Elks alike," who had fallen.

The hour of 11 p.m. has long held significance to the Elks. The 11th hour observance was originally a remembrance of the Battle of Hastings, which took place in the year 1066 A.D. Why is that? Because Englishman Charles Vivian, founder of the Jolly Corks which later became the Elks, simply borrowed most of the traditions and rituals from the Royal and Antedeluvian Order of Buffaloes, a fraternal organization to which he belonged that had started in England around 1010 A.D.

To this day, at any evening Elks event, all activity ceases, members and guests rise, the chimes ring 11 times and the "Eleven O'Clock Toast" is recited. (*the preceding is an excerpt from "McMenamin's Blog*")

### LAW ENFORCEMENT DART TOURNMENT JANUARY 8, 2022



Berea Elks Lodge #1815 will host a dart tournament to benefit the U.S. Marshals Survivors Benefit Fund (USMSBF).

USMSBF was formed exclusively for charitable and educational disbursements of its funds to the surviving family members of active United States Marshals, Deputy U.S. Marshals, Marshals Service employees, and Special Deputy U.S. Marshals who are killed in the line of duty. In the immediate aftermath of a line of duty death, money is given to the surviving family to help with funeral costs and other expenses. The USMSBF is private nonprofit charitable corporation, with Internal Revenue Service exemption status under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.

The anticipated format for the tournament is two member teams competing in games of 501 and Cricket. Individual team members can be either Elks or law enforcement/active or retirees. Entry fee for teams will be \$50 with all proceeds going to benefit USMSBF. Start time is expected to be at 9:00 am.

There will also be a cash bar during the tournament with all proceeds going to USMSBF. Additionally there will be 50/50 raffles being run during the tournament, again with proceeds going to USMSBF.
