#### DART LEAGUE IMPORTANT INFORMATION

Based on a positive response from many of our past dart league members, the Berea Elks are once again planning a Fall Dart League! Due to the ongoing pandemic, some changes will have to be made. We will only use boards #1 and #4 to maintain a safe distance, have 1 designated scorekeeper for each game, and all darters must wear a mask anytime they are throwing darts or moving around. The only time masks may be removed are when seated at a table eating or drinking.

Due to these limitations, based on the number of darters we end up with, we may have to split into 2 separate divisions. Our primary dart night will still be Tuesdays, but if needed, a Friday night division may be added. We plan on beginning the league late September or early October.

I need all interested darters to contact me expressing their desire to participate! Also, I need to know if you will be flexible for either Tuesdays or Fridays. If you are only available for one of those evenings, let me know that too. I ask that everyone contact me by mid-September at the latest. I realize these are some major changes, but they are necessary to keep everyone safe. I am hoping that we will be able to have a great league again with all the fun, competition and comradery Berea's dart leagues are famous for!

Please respond by Wed. September 16th! Don't forget to let me know if you are flexible for either Tuesday or Friday. If we only have enough darters for one night, it will be Tuesdays.

This will surely be the most interesting football season in memory. The lodge will be open during Sunday Browns football games throughout the season.


